Lauren Scott expressed that they did not find it appropriate that the motion asks for all Councillors to take part in a photo together, considering the poor history BIPOC members of Council have had with the Socialist Alternatives. Proposed amendment to Action Point 1, that it be reworded so that Councillors would instead be *invited* to participate in a solidarity photo.

Proposed amendment:

"To amend the wording of action point (1) to stating that a solidarity photo will be occurring and inviting councillors to participate, rather than stating that they will."

10.2 Pro-Vax, Pro-Union, Anti-Fascist

Preamble:

The anti-vaccine, anti-lockdown protests that took place in Melbourne last week should be condemned by all unionists.

The key demands of these protests were the complete abolition of public health restrictions and the suspension of vaccines. If these demands were realised, the result would be mass deaths and an overwhelming of the health system on a catastrophic scale such as we have witnessed in places like Italy or India over the past couple of years. The Secretary of the Victorian Nurses' Union (ANMF) correctly condemned these protests, aptly characterising them as "fighting for the right to overwhelm our health system".

These rallies had no clear organisation, but it is clear that there was a significant fascist element amongst the protesters. Chants of support for known Melbourne fascist Avi Yemini amongst the crowd, the prevalence of bigoted and anti-communist chants and slogans, and the disgraceful attacks on healthcare workers and the CFMEU headquarters were all evidence of this. These protesters weren't expressing 'legitimate concerns and grievances'. They were expressing a reactionary, individualistic and conspiratorial worldview- the toxic politics of the far right. It's important to remember that this 'let the virus rip' attitude has been stoked by business and their representatives, who want to put their profits before human life.

Unionism is about solidarity. In the context of the pandemic, solidarity means sticking together and supporting health measures which save lives, and protect the vulnerable and frontline workers. Right-wingers who want to fight to reopen business at the cost of public health need to be opposed. This means standing against the far right protesters on the streets of Melbourne, and the big business lobbyists pushing for a reckless reopening.

Platform:

1. UMSU stands with unions like the Nurses' Union (ANMF) in condemning the far right anti-lockdown protests

2. UMSU reaffirms support for public health measures like restrictions on non-essential business, PPE and ventilation, which have saved thousands of lives

3. UMSU opposes the government's 'national roadmap' which proposes an unsafe reopening of non-essential business before sufficient levels of vaccination are achieved to protect the population

Action:

- 1. Students councillors will participate in a solidarity photo to support the slogan 'Provax, pro-union, anti-fascist' as many other workers are doing
- 2. UMSU will take action together with other unions to oppose a reckless, profit-driven re-opening of the economy in Victoria and in opposition to those forces such as the protestors, who seek to jeopardise this.
