## **Summary**

### **Appointment**

Above Quota Elections was invited to tender for both a first semester by-election and a general election on 14<sup>th</sup> March. We were appointed to both on April 4. Jaimie Adam of Above Quota Elections Pty Ltd was appointed Returning Officer for the University of Melbourne Annual Student Election. Stephen Luntz and Haydn Steel, also of AQE, were appointed Deputy Returning Officers.

The early appointment greatly diminished the problems that have been experienced with getting access to the student roll in good time that have plagued recent years. It also diminished some, although not all, of the IT issues that have been present since the abolition of the MUSUL IT department.

The Electoral Tribunal at the time of the appointment consisted of Mr Michael Gronow, Behlinda Fehlberg and Mr Peter Lithgow.

### **Electoral Regulation Changes**

Electoral changes were modest this year, mostly involving changes to the authorisation procedures, which have been discussed under recommendations. There were also constitutional changes regarding the Southbank Department. These created some confusion, which might well have been worse if any positions at Southbank had been contested. We recognise the effort required for minor constitutional change, but suggest that the wording of the section regarding Southbank positions be clarified the next time other changes are made to the constitution.

### **Nominations**

Nominations opened on Monday 22nd July for positions on the following bodies:

- University of Melbourne Student Union (UMSU), including office-bearers, Students' Council and all committees (including Southbank and Burnley)
- UMSU by-elections to fill several positions for the remainder of 2019
- Delegation to the National Union of Students (NUS)

The notice of election appears on page 14. This notice was posted in Union House and on the elections website. Shorter versions, containing a link to the website, were published in Farrago and e-mailed to all students.

Nominations closed at midday on Friday 9th August. From the Returning Officer's perspective even fewer problems with the online nomination system were experienced than in the previous two years. The only problems reported with the online nominations this year was with students accidentally nominated for office bearers when they meant to run for committees, and then submitting a correction – certainly a minor issue. It seems the practice, introduced last year, of having a nomination receipt emailed to the registering officer is of great assistance here, as without it many of the students might

not have recognized their mistake before the nominations closed.

Once again many students submitted the same nomination multiple times, fearing it had not been registered, but no one complained that one they had submitted had not been posted after the close.

The major drawback of online nominations continues to be the number of candidates who now find it so simple to nominate they do so without having any intention of campaigning. In an effort to control this we limited the nomination form so it would only take one nomination for each section (sections being Office Bearers, Council, Committees, NUS and campus bodies) at a time. Students who wished to nominate for more than one position within a section could submit and log back in.

This produced some very interesting outcomes. Candidates on tickets nominating for two or more committees appeared to have no problems, simply submitting separate nominations. On the other hand, very few independents submitted multiple times. On the other hand, a number of independents seemed keen to maximize the number of nominations they could get on one form, and therefore nominated for positions at Southbank or Burnley, despite not being enrolled at either.

As a psychological experiment this was intriguing, and it also cut down the number of superfluous nominations, although not as drastically as we expected.

A total of 420 nominations were received (all using the electronic system), compared with 345 in 2018, 398 in 2017 and 417 in 2016. Although this represented a reversal of the decline of recent years, it was not reflected in increased campaigning. Instead, campaign numbers and intensity were lower than at any time since 2015.

Four nominations were submitted after the deadline. All of these were rejected, but two were appealed. The electoral tribunal upheld the decision to reject these, but ordered a by-election for the position in question, since it was unfilled for lack of nominations. The by-election was held from October 21-23 and will be the subject of a separate report.

Four nominations were rejected because they came from students enrolled at Parkville who had sought nomination to positions at Burnley or Southbank.

All candidates were notified by e-mail of the receipt of their nominations; one of the advantages of the electronic system was that this process happens automatically.

The Media Officers again produced an election guide, but opted not to host a debate amongst candidates as occurred last year.

The complete list of nominees appears on page 14, in ballot paper order where applicable. The draw for ballot paper positions was conducted on Monday 12th August. Encouragingly, after years of declining numbers of scrutineers, several people chose to watch part or all of the draw, including representatives from more than one ticket.

#### **Tickets**

Applications for ticket registration also closed at midday on Friday August 9. An information session for prospective tickets was held on August 1 to inform organisers of the requirements and attracted reasonable attendance. A subsequent session was held on Thursday August 29 for campaigners. As has

been the case in recent years, this attracted mostly the same people who had attended the original briefing, rather than the more representative attendance that was common a decade ago.

Fourteen ticket applications were received, one of which was rejected for being late, compared to 7 in 2018, 15 in 2017 and 17 in 2016.

Polling hours were extended at Burnley because there looked set to be a contest there, and in a year with less competition than usual for other positions it appeared this might be one case where added hours would be beneficial. However, after the decision had been announced, one of the candidates withdrew, eliminating its motivation.

Polling hours were adjusted at Southbank to reflect feedback last year that many students there are busiest in the middle of the day. The hope was that by varying the hours we could see which ones worked best. However, the lack of a contest for Southbank positions, and limited campaigning by the major tickets on that campus, meant turnout was very low on all days and the experiment returned no useful information, although it also did no obvious harm.

Turnout for the week was 2986 (including postals that were not received and rejected provisional votes). This was much lower than any election other than 2015, presumably reflecting the lack of a contest for the highest profile positions. The only positions that were close were those with restricted constituencies, and inevitably such positions will not drive turnout to the extent contests for president or general secretary will.

Turnout at Stop 1 went from being somewhat disappointing to pathetic. We have discussed this in the recommendations.

Voting figures from the polling registers were checked each evening against the total of ballot papers issued, and both were checked against the physical count after the close of polling. For the first time in many years there was a substantial discrepancy between the number of votes cast at two locations on specific days and the number of people signing the registers at those locations. Votes from each were initially quarantined, but we subsequently established that the number of votes checked off on the electronic roll in both cases balanced well with the votes counted. Once this was established the

Returning Officer ruled the poll clerks must have failed to ensure students signed the registers, but completed the more important part of the process by checking their eligibility on the roll, and therefore the votes were included in the count.

However, the results for certain positions leave out the quarantined votes, which is why not all positions have equal numbers of votes.

The table on page 30 summarizes the turnout at all polling stations.

### **Storage of Ballot Papers**

By arrangement with the University, unused ballot papers and live ballot papers from the Parkville polling stations were stored in a secure location in the Raymond Priestly Building each evening. Ballot papers for the VCA and Burnley polling places were stored securely by AQE staff, then returned to Parkville on Friday.

In all cases, scrutineers were invited to witness the sealing and unsealing of ballot boxes and the transfer of votes into storage, although in some cases no campaigners were present to act as scrutineers.

### **Electronic Roll and Provisional Voting**

Wireless database access to the electronic roll was used at all polling stations. The electronic version of the roll provided by the Melbourne University IT department was used once again.

The process of getting the roll set up proved much more difficult this year than last. AQE put in a request to have the roll uploaded to the University's app prior to the by-election and an individual was assigned responsibility to assist us. In the end this was not needed, since the by-election was uncontested, but the staff member told us to contact him as we approached the main election. When we did, however, we received a bounce-back reporting he no longer worked at the university and with an email address to contact in his stead. Messages to this address received no response, and repeated attempts, growing gradually more frantic, to find someone who could assist us were unsuccessful. Eventually, in desperation, we sought help from Maha Gnaamoorthy, who had assisted us in previous years. Maha indicated this was no longer her responsibility, but when no one else could be found to take it on, did so herself, even responding to an enquiry over the weekend following the election.

While we are extremely grateful for Maha's assistance, AQE finds it troubling that we were forced to rely on her generosity with her time.

A set of laptops was provided for use by poll clerks by the University Services. The fact that these were so much lighter than previously, and had much longer lasting batteries, was greatly appreciated although collection proved somewhat more challenging than in the past.

Despite experiencing no drop outs, 20 provisional votes were requested. Of these, 11 were accepted.

#### **Postal Votes**

Applications for postal votes closed at 5pm on Wednesday 30th August. Four applications were received. One of these was subsequently withdrawn, while another did not include an address to be sent to. Subsequent efforts to reach the applicant were unsuccessful.

Ballots were sent to the other two applicants, but neither was returned, even weeks after the close of voting.

Postal voting continues to be an unsatisfactory aspect of this election, but it is unclear how this can be addressed.

### **Complaints and Appeals**

The lack of a serious contest for President, General Secretary and Education Officers, among other positions, did not greatly diminish the number of complaints received this year. However, the Returning Officer team regard those that were received this year as less serious than in recent years.

This was not necessarily the view of the students involved. The greatest agitation centered around the photograph for the Stand-Up team, in which one candidate was making a hand signal. This signal has long-standing meanings positive meanings, for example by scuba divers to indicate safety or by basketball players to symbolize three-point shots, but has recently been adopted by white supremacists.

It was clear the individual making the signal was not intending to use it in its most recent meaning, and indeed denied being aware of this use. An opposing ticket, claimed the use of the symbol, however it was intended, made their campaigners feel unsafe. Their discussion of this mutated through word of mouth into an allegation of racism against their opponents, a slur we regard as very serious in the absence of substantial evidence and attempted to control. A particular problem was that one individual appeared to be spreading these allegations deliberately, but denied connection to any team.

The only appeal received related to the rejection of late nominations. As mentioned, the decision to reject the nominations was upheld, but a by-election was called.

### **Lockup and Counting**

Counting began at midday on Friday 6th September, five hours before the close of polling. A lockup was again instituted, in which scrutineers were permitted to observe the early counting but not to leave or communicate with outside prior to 5pm. The lockup again proceeded smoothly and without incident, largely due to the assistance of former Returning Officer Charles Richardson, who again came out of retirement to assist.

The majority of the office-bearer counts were declared on the Friday night, with others done early on the Saturday. Like last year two positions were close enough that provisional votes and the ballots set aside as a result of the register discrepancies could have swung the difference. This year the positions in question were Disabilities and People of Colour Officers. Both were recounted once all votes were finalised, confirming the preliminary results, although making People Of Colour even closer than the original tally.

Counting continued all day Saturday and for eight hours on Sunday, at the end of which every position had at least an initial count. Unlike in recent years none of the committees or students' council were particularly close.

As has been the case for many years, the count was conducted on the second floor of the Union Building, with the rooms locked so that only Union Security had access. Returning Officer staff needed to request access at the start of each day.

The full provisional declaration of results was issued on 11th September and was posted in Union House and on the elections website. The period for appeals against the results or requests for recounts, other than Clubs and Societies Committee, expired three working days later, on 16th September.

Full details of the count for each position appear in the Appendix. In addition, the count for President is broken down by day and by polling station.

The total valid vote of 2977 represents approximately 5% of eligible voters.

### **Clubs & Societies Committee**

The Clubs & Societies Committee is elected separately by the Clubs & Societies Council rather than by students at large. Management of that election has again been included as part of the contract for the annual election. The Clubs & Societies Council met on Thursday October 17 and the Returning Officer services were provided by Stephen Luntz and Bek Saltmarsh. The meeting was more rancerous than in recent years, and several ntentious issues were raised. In some cases these related to precedents from before AQE ran this part of the elections, but others related to ambiguities in the regulations. It is clear the part of the regulations covering clubs council has not had the continuous updating the election regulations have, and would benefit from a review.

Results have been published with the other positions.

### Recommendations

1) Bring Back Chalking: Chalking has been taken off the list of permitted forms of publicity. We consider this a mistake, and suggest it should be reversed. As a general rule Above Quota Elections believe it is best to allow forms of campaigning unless there is a strong reason not to. Some forms of publicity are banned because they are too expensive, and give an unfair advantage to wealthier teams.

This is not the case for chalking, which is relatively affordable, particularly if the old regulation banning chalk paints, but allowing block chalk, is revived. Nor is it obvious to us that chalking has other undesirable consequences, particularly compared to the annoyance many voters feel on having leaflets thrust in their hands.

On the other hand, chalking can be beneficial for elections. It can alert students whose only classes are after hours that the election is on. When done in a witty or artistic manner it may make students feel more positive about the elections and encourage them vote. It is also something that can be done with a low probability of getting into conflict with other campaigners, making it an excellent task to assign someone who is in a particularly volatile mood and could endanger the ticket otherwise.

- 2) Specifying closing times: At one point in the past the election regulations specified that all times referred to were Australian Eastern Standard Time. This has been removed, probably because it seemed too obvious to mention, but during the GSA elections one individual, who had submitted a nomination late, argued that they were in another timezone and it was still before the deadline where they were. It would be undesirable for the election to be thrown into doubt by such a novel interpretation in future, and this is an easy matter to correct.
- 3) Close Stop One polling place and consult on Murrup Barak: Having a polling station at Stop 1 seemed like a good idea for many reasons, but it has failed to deliver, with very low turnout. Closing it would save the union money with little loss of amenity. We also suggest there should be consultation with the incoming Indigenous Officers, committee and staff of Murrup Barak about whether having a polling place there, particularly for two days, really benefits Indigenous students. The location has limitations, with the lounge being so small there is little privacy, and it is close enough to the Union Building that Indigenous students wishing to vote can easily walk across. The numbers voting there, while more per hour than Stop 1, are small. If the booth is genuinely offering something to Indigenous students the cost of running it is a price worth paying, but we are unconvinced of the demand.
- 4) Reopening period for positions with no nominations or specified by-election: This year no nominations were received by the deadline for Burnley Committee, Indigenous Committee, Indigenous Officer or Indigenous Representative on Council. Some of these have had the same situation occur in the past. In the case of Indigenous Officer nominations were received after the deadline. Leading to the tribunal ordering a by-election.

Although Above Quota Elections are happy to take on the extra work, we are mindful of the expense for UMSU.

Many organisations allow for positions to be reopened and re-advertised for a relatively brief period when insufficient nominations are received to match those available. Unless kept very short, such a reopening would create difficulties for the Returning Officer team if it related to a position in the main ballot pack.

However, in the time AQE has been administering the UMSU elections, none of these positions have ever lacked sufficient candidates. On the other hand, positions like Burnley and Indigenous, which are printed on separate ballot papers, can be processed later without difficulty. Therefore, it is worth considering having a reopening of nominations, perhaps for three working days, where insufficient nominations are received, increasing the chance of getting representation for positions that only small numbers of students are eligible for.

The alternative is to do as occurred this year, and hold a by-election late in the year. This adds to the cost of the election - substantially so if there is a contest. However, the additional cost would be reduced if the regulations specified the circumstances in which such by-elections were to be held, allowing more flexibility with the timing.

- 5) **Byelection regulations:** As we noted in our report for the first semester by-election, the regulations on opening hours are designed for by-elections where the position up for election is open to all students to vote. This creates excessive costs where only a small constituency such as Indigenous students or students at one of the smaller campuses are eligible to vote. We suggest it should be possible to create rules that can be adjusted to suit the circumstances.
- 6) Maintain the trial of the new authorisation regulations: The regulations have been changed with regard to authorisation of publicity broadly in line with our recommendations. Unfortunately, many candidates and campaigners did not register this, and still appeared to be working off the old regulations, creating unnecessary confusion and draining time and energy.

Nevertheless, as the election period wore on, and people started to become aware of the changes, things got better. We anticipate that this will continue in future years, and recommend giving the existing rules at least another year before considering changing them.

7) Conflict of Position Forms: The requirement for Conflict of Position forms to be submitted before the close of nominations is problematic, since many candidates are unaware of it. Currently, candidates running for multiple positions that cannot be held simultaneously must submit the form by that time, or be disqualified. However, many students do not know which positions can be held simultaneously, or are unaware of this rule entirely. Alerting them to this prior to the close of nominations is challenging for the returning officers.

The conflict of position statements are only actually required prior to the count starting, four weeks after the close of nominations. Changing the deadline for the submission of these forms would allow an opportunity to process the nominations and alert candidates to the need to lodge these forms. We suggest a deadline of a week after nominations close.

8) Review Regulations for Clubs Council: Clubs Council has a separate set of election regulations governing the election of Clubs and Societies Committee. These regulations have not been altered in many years. They are silent on some contentious issues, such as whether an individual can represent a club without being a member of the club. Some people believe this is not possible, as a result of a ruling made many years ago before AQE were administering this part of the election, creating some confusion. AQE recommend that it should be specified that membership of a club is a requirement to be a representative. We also recommend that where there is no currently serving president, a line of succession be established so that a club can still be represented.

Notice is hereby given that nominations will open at 12 midday on Monday 22nd July, for the 2019 University of Melbourne Annual Student Election.

Positions to be filled at the election include:

- 1. Office-bearers, committees and Students' Council of the University of Melbourne Student Union (UMSU), including the Burnley Student Department and the Victorian College of the Arts Department
- 2. Delegates to the National Union of Students (NUS)
- 3. Several vacant positions to be filled by by-election for the remainder of 2019

A complete list of positions appears at the end of this notice.

### Nominations close at 12 midday on Friday 9th August.

Polling will take place from Monday 2nd September until Friday 6th September (inclusive). **All students are eligible to vote**. A detailed schedule of polling times and locations will be posted after close of nominations. Students may also vote by post – applications for postal votes close at 5pm on Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> August.

**Tickets**: Any fifteen (15) students may register a ticket to run in the election by filling in the appropriate form. Applications for Ticket Registration open and close at the same time as nominations. It is not necessary to be on a ticket to run in the election.

Tickets that are running candidates for multi-member positions should also submit a form showing the order in which they wish their candidates to appear. Candidates running for positions that cannot be held concurrently should submit a form showing which positions they wish to hold in case of a conflict. Ticket registration forms, candidate order forms and conflict of position forms must all be submitted by close of nominations. All forms are available from the Returning Officer or can be downloaded from the election website (see below).

**Policy speeches**: Candidates may also, with their nominations, submit policy statements for publication in Farrago and on the election website. Policy statements must not exceed 300 words for UMSU office-bearer positions or 100 words for all other positions. A photo session for office-bearer candidates will be organized after close of nominations.

Please note that **all deadlines are strict** and cannot be extended. Candidates are strongly urged to lodge their forms well before the deadlines. Nominations should be submitted at http://union.unimelb.edu.au/elections. All other forms should be delivered personally to the Returning Officer or an authorised electoral official. (The Election Office on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of Union House will be open extensively throughout the election period, and appointments can be made by phone or email.) Where this is not practicable, please contact the Returning Officer to make other arrangements. Do not post forms without prior arrangement, as no responsibility will be taken for late or lost forms under those circumstances. It is not possible to accept faxed or emailed forms.

### **Restrictions on election**

Any student may nominate for any position unless otherwise specified below.

The position of Media Officers must be held jointly by teams of three or four candidates. All other officer positions, except for President and General Secretary, may be held either individually or by two candidates jointly. Candidates who are running as a team should each fill out a nomination form and submit them stapled together, with a single policy statement.

If more than one person holds the office of Women's Officer, one of them must be a Woman of Colour.

For all other committees, including the Burnley and VCA Committees and the general members of Students' Council (but not the NUS delegation), at least half of the members (ignoring remainders) must be women, provided there are sufficient female candidates.

Candidates for Queer Officer, Queer Representative on Students' Council and Queer Committee must be Queer students. (See Regulation 32.4 for further detail.) If more than one person holds the office of Queer Officer, one of them must be a Woman or Trans.

If more than one person holds any other office, one of them must be a Woman.

Candidates for Indigenous Officer, Indigenous Representative on Students' Council and Indigenous Committee must be Indigenous students.

Candidates for Disabilities Officer, Disabilities Committee and the Disability Representative on Students' Council must be students with disabilities.

Candidates for International Representative on Students' Council must be International students.

Candidates for Graduate Representative on Students' Council must be Graduate students. Candidates for the Burnley positions must be enrolled at the Burnley campus. Candidates for the VCA positions must be students of the Faculty of the VCA and Music.

No person can stand for election if they are employed half-time or more by UMSU, the University, MU Student Union Ltd or related bodies, or any combination thereof. In the case of the University Council position that includes any casual employment with the University. No person can stand for an office-bearer position if they have already served two terms of office as an office-bearer.

For further information on eligibility to stand and to vote in the election, please consult the Election Regulations, available at the UMSU Office and on the election website. Copies of the Regulations can also be obtained at the Election Office, where further enquiries are welcome.
